Session descriptions

Empowering Kanaka Ōiwi Students Through Dual-Credit Across Multiple Campuses

Join this interactive plenary to explore how Kamehameha Schools is intentionally implementing ASU Universal Learner Courses across campuses through diverse models — from study halls to in-person cohorts — all grounded in Native Hawaiian values and student needs. Learn how culturally responsive design, program scalability, and community impact are shaping dual-credit and career pathways for their students.

Engaging Learners: What Makes Accelerate ASU Courses Different

What sets Accelerate ASU courses apart from traditional dual-credit offerings? In this session, explore the intentional design behind ASU Universal Learner Courses — from flexible pacing and embedded supports to real-world relevance and rigorous standards.
